

IAAM Rules / CASRA Procedures

Please read the IAAM Soccer Rules from the IAAM website. Here are some additional differences between NFHS rules and what the IAAM requests:

- 1.) Illegal equipment cautions are shown to the offending player and not the coach.
- 2.) The clock continues running except for Penalty Kicks and major injuries. Do not stop the clock or add time for goals, cautions, or disqualifications.
- 3.) There is no overtime for JV or MS matches. For Varsity, it is the same as public schools – two 10 minute golden goal or sudden death periods. If you play the 20 minutes without a score, the match ends in a tie.

As far as CASRA procedures are concerned, here are a few reminders:

- A.) Plan to arrive at least 30 minutes before game time. This gives you time to find the field (especially if it is your first time there), and do a proper pregame.
- B.) All referees must wear the same uniform, adhering to the USSF Administrative Handbook for Referees. The only badge that is permissible is the CASRA badge. If you need one, let me know. If you do not have one, do not wear any other badge, only the CASRA one. No badge is preferable to wearing something else.
- C.) Game reports must be completed by the center referee or Ref#1 for every game through Arbiter. At the minimum, this must include the score, cautions, disqualifications, and serious injuries. All information other than the score should include the player's name, team, and number and be entered into the notes section of the report.
- D.) In addition to including it in the game report, ALL disqualifications must be emailed to me at dksoccer7@gmail.com and Hugh Blocker at hughblocker@aol.com the same day of the match. Please include all pertinent information describing the circumstances leading up to the disqualification.
- E.) If there is inclement weather and/or a match has been cancelled, you will receive an email notification from Arbiter. Do not assume that a match will be cancelled because of weather – unless you hear otherwise, the match is still on. If possible, please check your email before leaving for the field if you suspect foul weather. I will attempt to reach you by phone if there isn't sufficient notice, so ensure that the contact information in Arbiter is up to date, especially a mobile phone if that is how I would be contacting you.
