
IAAM Rules

- 1) Timing: 24-minute halves, 1 time out per team per half.
- 2) Number of Players: 6 field players plus goalkeeper (7-v-7). The CISC in-house extra player 5 goal difference rule DOES NOT apply to the IAAM games. The existing IAAM rules (which are the Du Burns rules) do not have goal-difference rules.
- 3) Goal Kicks: Always use a second whistle. After 2nd whistle, the goalkeeper may pick up the ball using handling privilege to distribute (or kick by any player of kicking team).
- 4) Out of play: Ball hits top net use CISC house rules, restart is below where it hit (exception - hits net over penalty areas for goalkick or corner).
- 5) Overtime: No OT, ties are ties until post-season.
- 6) Three Line Rule: THREE LINE RULE is used opposed to the CISC midfield rule. Line to corresponds with the top of arc connected to penalty area is the referee's judgement. Referee partners need to communicate. Midfield is well marked. No kick may cross all three lines in the air without touching something. Restart is from top of arc closest to offending team.
- 7) Pass Back to GK: A defender, within her defensive third (that imaginary line corresponding to top of arc), MAY intentionally pass back to her GK for handling privilege.
- 8) Payment: Sign the pay voucher from the home team to receive your check (in the mail 7-10 days later).
- 9) Pregame: Referees should conduct a pre-game with both coaches before the game. Topics to include: the location of 2 of the 3 lines (i.e. at the top of the arc), specify that a ball hitting the top net is put into play under where it hits (that's different from Du Burns), and review goalkeeper privileges (the IAAM goal kick procedure, IAAM passback allowances, the no bouncing the ball by the goalkeeper, and the no trapping a ball outside the penalty area to bring in and handle). In IAAM, teams can sub a keeper on the fly.
- 10) Remember: You are an ambassador, the face of Carroll Indoor, to these private high school programs. Look sharp, move into proper position, and communicate in a professional manner. A number of schools are contacting Carroll Indoor to host their games and it is our Board's goal to have good officiating be one of the reasons teams want to rent time at CISC.
